BASE METAL INDUSTRY IN ROMANIA

Metallurgical industry had an important place in the Romanian economy before 1990. After 1990, Romanian metal industry suffered some setback due to significant reduction of the sale markets and entry of foreign capital. Then, approximately 250,000 employees were working in the metallurgical sector in Romania. This number had decreased to 25,000 by 2015.

In 2014, 7,694 companies were active in the Romanian metallurgical industry, of which 948 were in the specific trade sector. Two years later, the figures were 7,592 and 798 respectively.

In 2016, despite working at 70.8% capacity, gross steel production in Romania amounted to 3.4 million tonnes. In 2016, production capacities in some metallurgical sectors in Romania increased compared to the previous year. The largest increases were recorded in steel used for continuous casting (+ 27.1%), coated products (+ 15.8%), cast iron and ferro-alloys (+1.6%) and hot rolled flat products (+ 1.4%).

In 2018, crude steel production was 3.62 million tonnes, 5.3% higher than 2017. In 2018, compared to 2017, most raw material consumption increased. The consumption of pellets for the production of blast furnace iron increased by 11.2%. There were increases in the consumption of iron ore and concentrates (+ 8.7%), as well as in the consumption of ferrous agglomerate (+ 4.8%) which led to an increase in the production of blast furnace iron by 8, 9%. Also, there was an increase of 3.6% of the consumption of ferroalloys for obtaining crude steel, which is also reflected in the increase of crude steel production by 5.3% compared to 2017.



Romanian metallurgical industry is concentrated around areas with economic potential, such as Bucharest-Ilfov. Most companies are registered in the North-West area (1485 companies, of which 1394 are involved in production activities and 91 involved in trade; Center (1189/63) and Bucharest-Ilfov (1053/216).

Although it has been privatized, Sidex Galati Steel Plant is a success story. It continued its activity under the name of ArcelorMittal. It was bought from the state in 2001 with 70 million Euros by Indian industrialist Lakshmi Mittal. In Romania, ArcelorMittal owns production units in Iasi, Roman and Hunedoara. ArcelorMittal Galati has now been rebranded as LIBERTY Galati.

The main copper plant in Romania is Cupru Min Abrud S.A - based in Abrud, Alba County. It specializes in the production of copper and copper ore. The company owns and operates Roşia Poieni copper mine which is the largest copper reserve in Romania and the second largest in Europe. CupruMin produces around 1.33 million tonnes of copper ore grading 0.36% copper per year from which 4,800 tons of copper metal is extracted.

Romania's main business partners in trade of base metals are: Germany, Italy, Hungary, France, Turkey, United Kingdom, Sweden, Morocco, Poland.
